

Construction Begins For WESTWOOD GREENWAY NEIGHBORHOOD PROJECT

The Westwood Neighborhood Greenway Project is located adjacent to the Exposition Light Rail at the Westwood/Rancho Park station on the City parcel between Overland Avenue and Westwood Boulevard. The Project aims to improve the Santa Monica Bay water quality conditions by reducing pollutants from urban runoff that flows through an existing underground storm drain under Overland Avenue. The stormwater will be diverted to new bioswales through pump stations for physical and biological treatment by flowing through various plant communities, soil medium, and through exposure to sunlight.

This Project, along with other approved Proposition O projects, will assist the City of Los Angeles in complying with the Santa Monica Bay Beaches Dry Weather Bacteria Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) requirements, making our beaches and bay waters safer and healthier, while meeting Environmental Protection Agency and federal Clean Water Act regulations. This Project is partially funded by the Proposition O Clean Water Bond. In 2004, Los Angeles voters appropriated \$500 million for stormwater pollution prevention projects.



SCOPE OF WORK

The Project components include a diversion structure at the existing storm drain along Overland Avenue, a sand filter, two bioswales, two pump stations, two hydrodynamic separators, piping, riprap, native and drought tolerant landscaping, interpretive signs, electrical and instrumentation control components, staging operations, excavation, removal/installation of asphalt concrete, and construction of curb and gutter.

This Prop O project is being implemented by the City of Los Angeles Bureau of Engineering in collaboration with the Los Angeles Sanitation and Environment.
